PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALEXANDRIA, STATE OF LOUISIANA, TAKEN AT A REGULAR MEETING HELD ON APRIL 4, 2017.

The Council of the City of Alexandria, Louisiana, met in a regularly scheduled meeting session at its regular meeting place, on Tuesday, April 4, 2017 at 5:00 P.M. Those present were the Honorable Roosevelt Johnson, Jim Villard, Joe Fuller, Jules Green, Ed Larvadain, Chuck Fowler and Harry Silver. Also present were Mayor Roy, Council Staff and Council Attorney Trey Gist.

The Council of the City of Alexandria, State of Louisiana, was duly convened as the governing authority of said City by the Honorable Roosevelt Johnson, who stated that the Council was ready for the transaction of business. The Invocation was pronounced by Reverend Turner and the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mr. Silver.

PRESENTATION

Mr. Guiyou Huang, Ph.D. the new Chancellor of LSUA introduced himself to the Council.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

He also mentioned that he thinks the city needs to take a look at flooding issues since Martin Park and particularly Spencer Street has major flooding problems.

Economic, Workforce and Planning Development Committee Chair, Mr. Fowler echoed Mr. Larvadain in thanking the city workers. He said all but one phone call, he received from citizens during the bad weather, was

positive. He proposed a resolution acknowledging and endorsing the activities, hard work and repairs that went on during the storms on Sunday.

Mr. Green commented that all of the workers were on top of their game and that the employees did a superb, above average job and that they all worked diligently.
